



Stadium fire damage could reach \$150,000

This is what the new football equipment looks like after a fire Tuesday night July 31st. The fire gutted the coaches' offices, equipment and storage facilities and left traces of smoke and water throughout the home team's locker room, and restroom.

An electrical panel that controls the pubic-address system and scoreboard was a mass of melted wires.

This took place just a few days before practice was to start.

Coaches from Ames, West Des Moines Valley, and Dowling Catholic all offered help to include equipment by late Wednesday morning. Activities director Ric Powell said the damage would be covered by insurance. Also athletic equipment suppliers banded together to expedite replacement of equipment. There was a real outpouring of empathy as well as material help offered. Even Hy-Vee grocery store on the east side held a Spaghetti feed with the proceeds going to the EHS Athletic program. East High is now playing in their own uniforms and equipment.

The fire is still under investigation.

Dick was a member of the 1956, One Mile Relay State Track Championship Team. His Relay Team also won the Two Mile Relay at the Drake Relays. In 1955 Dick helped the East Cross Country Team finish 9th at the State Meet.

Dicks family includes his wife of 50 years, Sandy Frakes, and his son Randy Frakes who was inducted into the East Athletic Hall of Fame for his baseball honors in 2010.

Bill Burke – Track - 1952 -1953 Bill is the Husband of our own **Norma (Treanor) Burke** class of 1956.

Bill was a State Champion in the One Mile Relay in 1952 and the Two Mile Relay in 1953.

In 1952, Bill won Track Championships in the Grinnell, Valley and Oskaloosa Relays as well as the Big 6 Conference Champions. Bill also won Championships in the Drake Relays and District meet.
