RETIREMENT IN THE SLOW LANE-OR LIVING IN A 35' MOTORHOME

Skipping through time to 35 years after graduation from East. This is an outline of some of our activities since "Retirement". My wife Karen (Bryan EHS 59) and I have always been RVer's, starting in the early 70's with a 19' camping trailer, and then in 1978 moving up to a 23' Class C Motorhome in which we camped and vacationed for 12 years. After my retirement from IBM in 1991, we decided to move to a larger Class A motorhome, and acquired a 32-footer. In 1994 we sold our home in Southeast Polk. Karen retired from Prinicipal Insurance Company, and we moved our home base to Table Rock, MO. We then started to travel to the south in the winter, spending 4-6 months living in the motorhome, and then returning to the Midwest in the summer. Florida seemed to become our favorite winter destination; we became "Snowbirds".

Somewhere in this timeframe we joined the Family Motor Coach Association (FMCA) and a chapter in the FMCA called the Ozark Schooners. This chapter of about 60 Motorhome owners holds at least 6 rallies each year in different locations throughout the US. A typical rally agenda includes visits and tours of local sites of interest such as National Parks, State Capitals, Museums, Zoos, Theaters, Restaurants, etc. There is also plenty of time for daily continental breakfasts, social hours, an occasional Potluck, a catered meal, and entertainment.

In 1996 we purchased a home in an "55" and older village in Bonita Springs, FL., and became Florida residents. This eventually became our home base and we traveled in the motorhome during the summer; traveling first to Des Moines and then to several of the rallies mentioned above.

Finally in 2001 we sold out in Florida and became "Full timers", living in our 36 ft Holiday Rambler motorhome 12 months a years. We spend 6 months in Florida where we still work seasonally at H & R Block and Hallmark, and 6 months on-the-road. It's been a great time, however we are looking forward

to re-establishing a home base in Southeast Polk again in 2004.

Traveling in our Motorhome during the last 8 years has allowed us a opportunity to experience and enjoy many things: camping at a Buffalo Ranch in Wyoming , photographing Alligators and Manatees from an airboat in Florida, watching the Cadets march at the Naval Academy in Annapolis, white water river rafting in Wyoming, touring a light-house on the coast at Newport, OR. We have also visited numerous National and State Parks, Museums, Historical sites, Monuments, Restaurants, Theaters, Capitals, and Elks Lodges throughout the 38 States and Washington, DC.

It has been a real trip in the "slow lane".

GETTING EAST READY FOR FALL CLASS



Worker smooths primer to get Bldg ready for Students

In early August workers scrambled to get a auxiliary Bldg ready for student occupancy. They had two weeks to paint walls, install doors, light fixtures, toilets and sinks, lay carpet, pour concrete for sidewalks and driveways, move chairs, desks, kitchen equipment and cafeteria tables.

They had two weeks to finish remodeling an auxiliary building that will house this years estimated 700 ninth-graders, as well as the school cafeteria for East's 2000 students.

More than 100 workers, some pulling 10-12 hour shifts, are scrambling to complete work on the building to complete it before school started on Aug. 21st.

East High School's \$18 million renovation project began this summer with demolition of the school's cafeteria. In its place will be a new building that will include offices, science laboratories, a cafeteria and a student center. Renovation and expansion plans also include new classrooms, air conditioning, windows and an elevator.

While the three-year renovation is under way, East's ninth-graders will attend classes in the auxiliary building located at 1421 Walker St., about a block east of the high school. The cafeteria also will be in this building.

Duane Van Hemert, executive director of facility management for Des Moines Schools said much of the work will be completed in time.

INVEST IN THE FUTURE PROJECT

The campaign to raise \$5,000,000 to provide funding for additional building projects not covered by the \$18,000,000 raised by the local option 1% sales tax is going well. They now have over \$4,000,000 in pledges. But they still need to raise almost another million.

Please donate what you can, no matter how large or small, it all adds up.

In 2006 it will be nice to see the differences in our "Ol Alma Mater".
