## QUILL HAS MOVED TO THE FAST LANE

The 2004 East High yearbook is the product of months of work in adviser Ed Kelly's class.

This is not your mother's annual. The modern version is crammed with hundreds of candid and active photos. Created on computers, students can pour all their graphic, writing and artistic skills into making the book reflect the style and attitude of their class.

The East staff has the task of keeping the school's traditional red and black cover. This year they went with the image of a speeding red race car on a black background.

"Our theme was "Life in the Fast Lane", to make East seem like we're surpassing the other schools", said design editor and senior Barbie Morris, who carried the theme inside the book with checkered flag details.



Some pages seem clipped from magazines, with lots of photos and articles about summer vacations, clothing trends, and school events. It's a long stretch from the yearbooks of yore with their pasted together photo collages.

A full color yearbook would be the state trophy of books, a holy grail to be pursued. East's staff delight in the color pages they have and long for more.

Yearbooks are a big business. Yearbook students sell about \$20,000 in ads. Production costs total about \$35,000 to print 1,150 yearbooks.

The high cost is partly because yearbooks have grown. East's yearbook has more than 330 pages.

This much has not changed: The most memorable stuff in yearbooks is often added after the staff work is done, when the students get out their pens and scrawl messages across any blank space.

# SCOOBY DOO DIVING DAN

Sharon has had some eye surgery, and she said she was doing fine. Sure hope she continues to do so.


We had a very nice time and enjoyed their company a lot. Sure hope to see them at the 50<sup>th</sup> reunion in 2006.

We will be happy to do so Lyle, and I am sure East will be happy to get them. Thank you for sharing.






East High's contribution to the state Legion Oratorical contest was Laima Aulis, pictured with her coaches Mr. Schakel and Miss Whitford.
